





8 mm/Super 8 Reel-to-Reel Video Conversion

We are excited to announce that Tinley Park Public Library cardholders may now utilize a reel-to-reel film converter at our Conversion Station. Called a RetroScan, the machine is capable of digitizing 8 mm and Super 8 film without audio. Classes on the RetroScan are offered monthly (see p. 7) and assistance with the RetroScan is provided for cardholders who make appointments. Please remember that conversions take place in real time. We recommend bringing your own storage media (flash drives or external hard drives) to your appointment.
