

A maximum of two standard-sized paper boxes per car, filled with your sensitive papers (bank statements, bills) is allowed. Approximate dimensions: 16" x 8" x 12". Shredding representatives remove the boxes from your car, take them to the shredding truck, and shred them on-site.






