The TPPL is a proud recipient of the "Back to Books" grant.

Earlier this year both the Youth Services and Adult Reference departments were awarded "Back to Books" grants from the Illinois State Library.

Youth Services purchased over 280 non-fiction books for beginning and developing readers in kindergarten through second grade.

"We are delighted to support our young students in strengthening their new reading skills while helping them explore their world with topics like wild animals and pets, weather and seasons, outer space, geography, and community helpers," said Youth Services Manager Kerry Reed.

Adult Reference Librarian Beth Faulkner applied for the grant to increase the availability of popular and classic titles in the Large Print format. The grant was used to purchase more than 250 titles by bestselling authors such as Danielle Steel and David Baldacci, as well as classic titles by Jane Austen and Charles Dickens.

"Large print books cost more than regular print books," said Faulkner, "and this grant helps us offset that cost."
