New Rules for Using Orland Park Library

As of April 2013, the Orland Park Library is no longer part of the SWAN online consortium. For Tinley Park card holders, there are several things to be aware of. If you wish to check out materials from the Orland Park Library, you may still use your Tinley Park card but your card will need to be entered into their system. **This may be done by visiting the Orland Park Library with your library card and filling out a short form.** Also, please note that if you check out materials from Orland Park, **you must return them to the Orland Park Library**. Material owned by the Orland Park Library will no longer appear in the SWAN online catalog. We can no longer clear their items off your record. Additionally, **please do not return Tinley Park materials to Orland Park**.

No More Fees!
