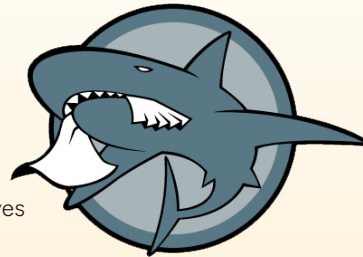

We've signed up with a new service to help satisfy your craving for variety in ebooks: eRead Illinois/Axis 360.

Supplementing the titles already available from Media on Demand, eRead Illinois/Axis 360 is a shared collection of ebooks for adults, teens, and children. These ebooks may be downloaded to personal computers as well as to many mobile devices, including Android, iOS, and Kindle Fires. The Technology Roundup: Connecting Our Patrons to Technology

Recently, we hosted an exciting new event: The Technology Roundup. Intended as a means to better connect our patrons to the library's digital services and to technology in general, the event provided a venue for patrons of all ages to bring in their new (or old) devices and get hands-on help and answers to all of their questions.



Utilizing our experienced library staff and partnering with volunteers from local tech retailers and bookstores meant that we could offer this event on a Saturday in a four-hour-long open-house setting. The generous time frame and open forum, with no need to pre-register, fostered a relaxed atmosphere for patrons and tech navigators alike. Personal attention and the availability of drop-in demos throughout the day meant that attendees were able to receive in-depth instruction on a variety of topics.

Many of the questions dealt with downloading ebooks and audiobooks and accessing Mango Languages and Zinio digital magazine services. Young children and teens learned how to connect with online homework resources and seniors got comfortable navigating our library website.
