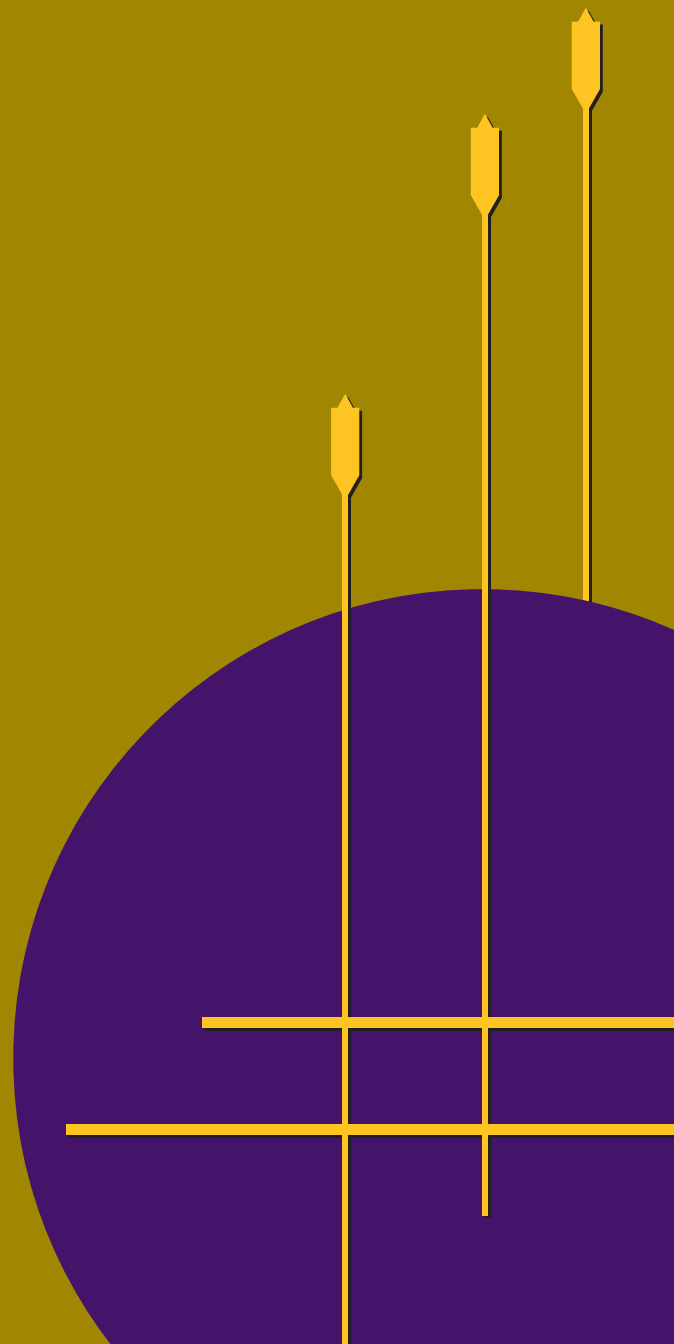

Hungrytown in Concert

We are thrilled to welcome the internationally-acclaimed American folk duo Hungrytown to our Outdoor Pavilion on Wednesday, June 28 at 7 pm!

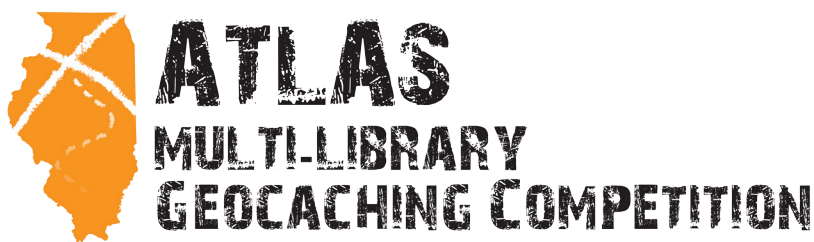
After more than a decade of world-wide touring and three album releases, Hungrytown band members Rebecca Hall and Ken Anderson have earned a reputation for the quality and authenticity of their songwriting and music. The couple spends more than half of each year on the road and has attracted a dedicated following in America, Europe, and New Zealand.

Hall and Anderson met in New York City, where they had already been performing regularly—

Hall as a jazz singer and Anderson as a drummer for a variety of garage bands. Their introduction to folk music came later, when a close friend who died young entrusted to them her collection of 1960s folk albums and her guitar. Inspired by the grit and true-to-life experiences she heard in these traditional ballads, Hall was inspired to write the lyrics that later became her first songs, aided by Anderson's flair for musical arrangement. Soon afterward, Hall released two solo albums, *Sings!* in 1999 and *Sunday Afternoon* in 2002, both produced by Anderson. In the winter of 2003, the duo quit their desk jobs, moved to the green hills of Vermont, and decided to pursue a full-time career as touring musicians.

They released their first CD, *Hungrytown*, in 2008, *Any Forgotten Thing* in 2011, and *Further West* in 2015. Hungrytown's authentic music has received extensive radio airplay worldwide and has appeared on several television shows, including *The Daily Show* and *Portlandia*.

In case of inclement weather, this concert will be held indoors and have a limited attendance of 125.
