


WHO CAN GET A LIBRARY CARD?

- Anyone who lives in incorporated Tinley Park or Orland Hills
- Anyone who owns or leases taxable residential or business property in incorporated Tinley Park or Orland Hills
- Individuals who live in unincorporated Tinley Park may apply for a non-resident fee card. Please call us at 708.532.0160, x3 for more information.

HOW TO GET YOUR LIBRARY CARD:

Stop by the Checkout Desk with your Illinois drivers license or state ID with your current address. If the address is not current, please provide a current utility bill addressed to the applicant. A parent's or legal guardian's signature is required on the application and library card of anyone under the age of 18.

Our staff were eager to see community members back in the building— as our Adult Services Librarian, Doug Ferrini, said: "I am looking forward to the information exchange with our patrons—that is what I missed the most—the 'What have you been watching and reading and listening to?' conversations. We have a lot of catching up to do!"

We were so pleased to see the 269 community members who showed up on July 19. So many of you expressed your love for the library, and it showed through in the 1,609 you checked out or renewed in the three short hours we were open. We are grateful to serve this community of readers, and we were especially grateful to see everyone doing their best to keep the community safe by wearing face coverings and adhering to social distancing guidelines—**thank you**.

Although we can't predict how COVID-19 will impact us throughout the fall and winter of 2020-2021, we want to help you understand how the library will continue to be here for you, no matter what happens. Please be aware that some operations, such as the transfer of items between libraries, are beyond our library's control and may take longer than usual.

Our Administration developed a Phased Reopening Plan that was approved by the Library Board of Trustees at its meeting on May 27, 2020. The plan allows us to easily adapt to the everevolving nature of this pandemic, while guaranteeing that we can still perform our core functions and do our best to meet the needs of the community.

At the time of this writing, we are in Phase 4 of our Phased Reopening Plan, and hope to be moving into Phase 5 soon. Should circumstances require us to move back into Phase 3 and close our doors again, you will still be able to:

- Schedule curbside pickup of your holds
 - If you cannot use curbside pickup due to health concerns, please contact us and ask about homebound delivery
- Return books through our outdoor book drops
- Attend virtual events
- Pick up a Browsing Bundle (3-5 handpicked books and movies)
- Drop off your old VHS, reel-to-reel film, vinyl records, and cassette tapes to have them digitized
- Use Libby/OverDrive, Hoopla, and Kanopy to find eBooks, audiobooks, and movies
- Sign up for a library card online

If circumstances allow us to move forward into Phase 5, you will be able to:

- Visit us during our regular hours of Monday-Friday, 9 am-9 pm, Saturdays, 9 am-5 pm, and Sundays, 12-5 pm
- · Sit and study in the library
- Use our public computers

When physical distancing is no longer strongly recommended, limitations on gatherings have been fully lifted, and a vaccine is widely available, we will gradually reintroduce all prepandemic library services, including in-person events.

We can't say it enough—thank you for supporting us during this unprecedented, challenging time. The messages you have sent us—"Out of everything that was closed, I missed the library the most!"—touch our hearts and help us remember why we are here: to enrich the community by providing dynamic resources, exceptional service, and reliable information. No matter what happens, we are here for you.
