The Children Act by Ian McEwan

In this twenty-first-century fable about faith versus science and the state, British High Court Justice Fiona Maye is called upon to decide whether Adam Henry, a Jehovah's Witness with leukemia, should be forced to undergo a life-saving blood transfusion prohibited by his faith.

July 28

Mrs. Grant and Madame Jule by Jennifer Chiaverini

A fictional exploration of the decades-long relationship between Julia Grant, Civil War general's wife and later first lady, and her house slave Jule, who, upon the signing of the Emancipation Proclamation, claimed her freedom and rose to prominence as a gifted hairdresser and businesswoman in her own right.

A Spool of Blue Thread by Anne Tyler

Brilliant dialog and nuanced insight into the complex messiness of family relationships are Anne Tyler's signature gifts. In this, her twentieth novel, she chronicles the Whitshank clan through three generations in their family homestead in Baltimore, Maryland. The decline of parents Red and Abby Whitshank triggers a gathering of the clan; sibling rivalry, jealousy, avarice, compassion, and generosity vie for dominance among their fractious adult children.

In a small village in Ireland, Nora must learn to cope with death of her beloved husband — the man who rescued her from the stifling world into which she was born. Nora's struggle to awaken from grief and discover her own space are chronicled with remarkable restraint and sympathy.

by Liane Moriarty

Sometimes the adage "Don't judge a book by its cover" is just plain bad advice. The exploding lollipop on that graces the jacket of *Big Little Lies* reveals a lot, but not the tantalizing secret of whodunit (and what sort of violence, exactly, was done) on Trivia Night at Pirree Public School. Feuding parents, bullying kids, and mean girls who never grew up are among the volatile ingredients of this suburban noir tale by the popular author of *The Husband's Secret*.

Dead Wake: The Last Crossing of the Lusitania

by Erik Larson

One hundred years ago, 11 miles off the coast of Ireland, the Cunard superliner *Lusitania* encountered a German submarine. Within 18 minutes, the *Lusitania* sank, taking with it 1200 passengers, many of them women and children. Popular historian Larson brings this maritime disaster to life and probes still-unanswered questions: Why was there no naval escort? What caused the explosion that likely sank the ship? What did First Lord of the Admiralty Winston Churchill know and when did he know it?

Books with Buzz, our bestselling book discussion group, meets on the third Thursday of every other month. The July 16 selection is Judy Blume's *In the Unlikely Event*.

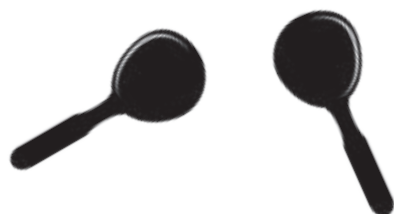
