We are now circulating a variety of ereaders with titles for all ages. For a Nook or Kindle Touch with adult titles, please visit the Adult Reference Desk or call at 708.532.0160, x1. For a Kindle Touch with teen or juvenile titles, visit the Youth Services Desk or call 708.532.0160, x2.

All are invited to board the Media on Demand Digital Bookmobile, which will be stationed in the east parking lot from 10:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. Saturday, June 9. Those on board will be able to test-drive a variety of ereaders and mobile devices and learn how to download free audiobooks and ebooks. Make plans to stop by.

New library catalog features

The library's online catalog SWAN (System-Wide Automated Network) now offers a number of new features to streamline your busy reading life. To utilize these features, access your SWAN account by clicking on the yellow "My Account" button on the library homepage and entering your name, library card number, and PIN.

If you are planning a vacation and don't want to lose your place on a waiting list for library materials, use the "Freeze Holds" feature by checking the "Freeze" box that corresponds with the item you are not ready to receive. Your hold will continue to move up the queue; once it reaches the top, it will remain there until you uncheck the "Freeze" box.

You may now choose to receive weekly emails that list items recently added to SWAN that match your customized criteria. Once you conduct a search and see a list of interesting items, click on the "Save as preferred search" button at the top of the screen. To initiate the emails, visit your Preferred Searches and check the box "Mark for Email."

Multiple "Wish Lists" may be created to help organize items you may want to request in the future. Once you conduct a search and find an item to add to your Wish List, click the "Add to My Wish List" button at the top of the screen.






