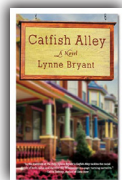


August 26 – *Calico Joe* by John Grisham

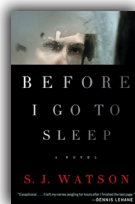

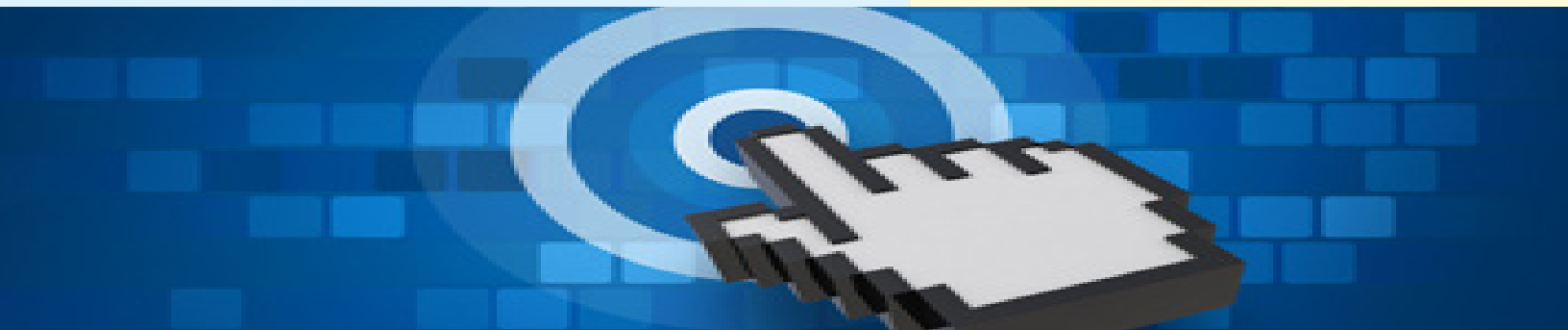
