Christmas @ the White House


Monday, December 1 at 7 pm

Happy Birthday, Jane Austen



"I declare after all there is no enjoyment like reading! How much sooner one tires of anything than of a book! When I have a house of my own, I shall be miserable if I have not an excellent library. The person, be it gentleman or lady, who has not pleasure in a good novel, must be intolerably stupid."

Jane Austen was an English novelist who, using wit and social observation, provided astute insights into 19th-century life.

Jane began to write in her adolescence and often read her stories aloud to her family. It took time, however, for her novels to be accepted by a publisher and, due to the lack of acceptance of women authors, her first works were published anonymously. The first, *Sense and Sensibility,* was published in 1811, swiftly followed by *Pride, and Prejudice, Mansfield Park* and *Emma. Persuasion* and *Northhanger Abbey* were published posthumously. Her novels have never since been out of print. Jane never married and was only 41 when she died.

Amy Dickinson, who writes the syndicated column *Ask Amy*, started a new holiday tradition: She encouraged readers to leave a wrapped book on their children's beds on Christmas morning.






each other until a betrayal threatens to change their lives forever.




