Rick Riordan is the author of the Percy Jackson and the Olympians series (of which The Lightning Thief is the first book) as well as The Heroes of Olympus, Trials of Apollo, The Kane Chronicles, and Magnus Chase. Riordan's forte is putting a spin on tales of old in a modern way with witty characters and action packed plot.

Percy Jackson lived in New York and was never able to stay at the same school for more than a year. By sixth grade, he was used to it. But, an encounter on his school trip to the museum left him questioning everything he thought was true. He learned that what he thought was myth was completely real, and that his father was not who he thought he was.

This book will never not be good. It is such a comfort read and the characters feel like home. Percy's humor is amazing and his banter with Annabeth especially is so great. I also love the honesty and wit that Rick Riordan infuses into Percy's character. This is such a classic and I could reread it forever.
