#### Apply in person:

When the library is open, stop by the Checkout Desk with your Illinois driver's license or state ID with your current address. If the address is not current, please provide a current utility bill addressed to the applicant. A parent's or legal guardian's signature is required on the application and library card of anyone under the age of 18. #### Apply online:

You can sign up for your library card online at **tplibrary.org/get-a-library-card**. If your application is approved, you'll receive an email containing your account information, and you can immediately begin using your account to access online resources including eBooks, audiobooks, and streaming movies! Full access to our catalog will be approved within seven business days.

uneteenth is the oldest nationally celebrated commemoration of the ending of slavery in the United States. Although the Emancipation Proclamation was made effective in 1863, enslaved people in Confederate-controlled Texas would not be free until much later. Freedom finally came on June 19, 1865, when some 2,000 Union troops arrived in Galveston Bay, Texas to announce that all enslaved Black people in the state were free by executive decree. This day came to be known as "Juneteenth."


