E/Fiction Teckentrup	<b><i>Get Out of My Bath!</i></b> by Britta Teckentrup Ellie the elephant's relaxing bath is disrupted by splashing friends, prompting her to suck up all of the water into her trunk until everyone else leaves.
E/Fiction Thomas	<b><i>Can You Make a Scary Face?</i></b> by Jan Thomas A ladybug invites the reader to play a game of "let's pretend."
E/Fiction Tullet	<b><i>Mix it Up!</i></b> by Hervé Tullet Using no special effects other than the reader's imagination, simple directions lead the reader to experiment with mixing and changing colors on the printed page.
E/Fiction Willems	<b><i>Mo Willems Presents That Is Not A Good Idea!</i></b> by Mo Willems A surprising lesson about the importance of listening to one's inner gosling ensues when a very hungry fox issues a dinner invitation to a very plump goose.
